General Dynamics F-111A #67-0102

January 12, 1988

On January 12, 1988, F-111A #67-0102 departed from Mountain Home AFB, Idaho, for a routine training mission. The aircraft was with the 389th Tactical Fighter Squadron, 366th Tactical Fighter Wing. In the cockpit was instructor pilot Capt. Frederick Gerhart and student pilot Capt. Robert Meyer. As the aircraft left the runway the right-hand canopy popped open, causing significant aerodynamic drag. The F-111A rolled over inverted, stalled, and crashed a short distance from the base. Both pilots were killed instantly. Today most of the aircraft has been removed, but numerous small pieces are scattered across several hundred yards.
